# Superintendent's Annual Report on Student Achievement

Superintendent Hooker provided his Annual Report on Student Achievement noting the change in format using the template provided by the Ministry. He reviewed "Improving Areas of Student Achievement" highlighting the improvement in Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) results and how the MDI is used as a "jumping off point" for discussion and planning. The MDI results are reviewed with staff and students and the feedback is used to develop school growth plans and activities related to student health and wellness. He also reviewed the "Challenging Areas" noting that schools will continue to focus on student health and wellbeing within their school goals. Superintendent Hooker then reviewed "Programs/ Performance/Results & Intervention" and the 3 goal areas of Student Health and Well-Being, Increasing Students' Reading Achievement and to Increase the number of Students Graduating and Completing School.
